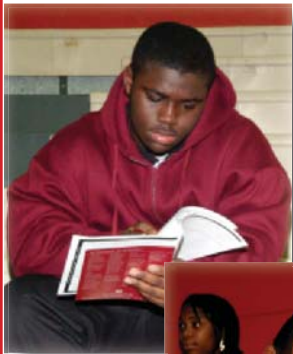

## Student Preparation Guide



**S**eniors should bring at least 12 copies of your

Online Registration Form to the Fair in addition to an equal number of copies of your high school transcript or GED transcript, SAT/ACT scores and résumé (if you have one.)

- By giving your completed Online Registration Form, your transcript, SAT or ACT scores, and your résumé to each college representative whose college you are interested in attending, you will save time and have more fruitful discussion with the College Representative of your choice.
- Each College Representative who receives one of the packets you have prepared will be able to do a preliminary on-the-spot review of your record to determine your qualifications for admissions.
- One of your Online Registration Forms will be used to enter you into a drawing for the Grand Prize Raffle at the end of the Fair.



## Preparing for the College Fair

1. Some preparations before attending the Fair will make your participation more productive. Consider the following questions, and then visit the tables of the colleges and universities that best fit your goals.
2. Prior to attending the Fair, use the Internet to research each of the schools you are interested in attending.
3. Do you want to attend; a large school or a small one, an urban (city), suburban, or a rural school.
4. How far away from home do you want to go?
5. Have you taken the SAT or ACT and do you know your test scores and grade point average?
6. Do you want to participate in athletics? If so, does the school offer your sport?
7. Do you want to participate in other extracurricular activities?
8. Do you have any special needs, such as tutoring note takers, interpreters, signers, assisted-hearing devices, etc.?
9. How much can you afford to pay in tuition, fees, and other expenses?



## Ten Questions to Ask the College Reps

1. I am a senior and have my SAT/ACT scores, transcript, Grade Point Average, and completed application. Can you waive my application fee?
2. If I meet your admissions requirements can you give me on-site admission?
3. I have visited your school's web site and have noted the tuition; however I would like to verify that the tuition has not changed. How much is the tuition this year, and do you anticipate that it will increase next year? What other fees are required? How much is room and board?
4. What scholarships are available?
5. What is the average financial package at your school?
6. What academic support services do you offer such as free tutoring?
7. What student activities (sports, clubs, organizations, newspaper, etc.) do you offer?
8. Do you assign faculty advisors?
9. How safe is your campus?
10. What partnerships do you have with employers for student internships and job opportunities?
